Scooters

We have had a concern raised, by neighbours in Howard Road, about pupils on scooters. They report that some children are racing down the pavement unsupervised by an adult. This is very dangerous as residents may be driving out of their properties at this time. We would like to remind all parents and carers that children on scooters must scoot slowly and stay with their adult. If your child finds it difficult to follow this important rule we suggest they do not come on a scooter. Please ensure anyone else who brings your child to school is aware of the school safe scooting charter. You must have signed this charter if your child brings a scooter to school.

Skillful Scooting

- Children riding a scooter to school must be accompanied by an adult at all times and to stay within a range of control of the adult.
- Children must not scoot too far ahead of the adult even when going downhill
- When the footpath is very crowded, for example by the school entrance, children should only scoot at walking pace.
- Children are requested to wear something bright (eg. a red school coat) when travelling to school so they can be seen in the darker months. The school would encourage children to wear a helmet as this is good practice for the future when they may ride on roads.
- Children must scoot on the pavement at all times and dismount to cross roads with an adult.
- Children must dismount before entering the school playground and walk their scooters to the parking facility.
