Outcomes:

End of KS assessments for 2016 show 100% of PP pupils met expected standards in reading, 100% of PP pupils often met the expected standard in maths and science. 100% of PP pupils are working towards the expected standard in writing. Very good progress was made in reading and 100% of pupils in receipt of PP reached the expected standard in the phonics test.

100% of pupils in EYFS did not reach expected standards but did make outstanding progress.
