SUMMER 1 IN RABBIT CLASS

Our topic for this half term is:

The Secret Garden

Our focus for this half term is living and growing. We will look at how plants and animals grow and what conditions are needed for this to happen. Sowing seeds in pots and working on our vegetable plot will keep us busy. Our bean diaries will help us to observe change over time. We will also look at how humans change as they grow and discuss our families and what makes us special.

Your child has been bringing home phonetically decodable books which should enable them to be successful readers and help develop their love for reading. The books will be swapped twice a week. They will also be bringing a quality text from our class or school library which they will choose for themselves, this can be shared together to explore new vocabulary and information.

The aim of the new decodable books is to develop confidence and fluency, by allowing your child to repeat the book again and again enables them to read without sounding out and therefore have a better understanding of the text. They will also be able to develop other skills such as pausing for punctuation and using expression in their reading.

The children will continue the reading challenge. Each day they read at home they can move their name up the challenge. Each ten reads they receive a sticker and when they have read 100 times they will receive a prize!

This term for show and tell we will start 'What's in the bag?'. The children will take it in turns to take home a blue bag and book. Please help your child to choose what they would like to show the class and think of three clues, so their friends can guess. Please help your child to write these clues.

We are always happy to share learning your child has done at home or photos, news or certificates from special events. Please do not allow your child to bring toys into school.

Please keep sending in 'wow' moments and value leaves that we will share with the class and add to our display. If you do not have a leaf template for the values tree it can be written in your child's green link book which we will then write on a leaf in school before sharing.

Remember to check Tapestry to see observations about what your child has been doing at school. We would love you to add home achievements too.
