Dear Parents and Carers,

As far as we are aware, we remain in the fortunate position of having no positive Covid-19 cases within the school community but as you know the numbers are on the rise both locally and nationally. With this in mind, I am taking this opportunity to remind you of the procedures for drop off and collection that we have in place to minimise the risk of spreading the virus. The timings remain the same as before half-term and can be seen below.

Please ensure that you stick to the arrival times and wait in line until it's your time to go through to the playground. If you are slightly early, please can we ask that you do not congregate with other families. With the changes from Thursday we are no longer allowed socially distanced groups of up to six in public places and can now only be with one other person from another household. UK Government announced today that from Thursday: 'You can exercise or visit outdoor public places with the people you live with, your support bubble, or 1 person from another household (children under school age, as well as those
