I hope that you have all had a fabulous summer and that your children are excited to be starting at school next week, we are definitely looking forward to seeing them all.


In this letter I have included details of what school will be like when the children start. For those of you who have older siblings through the school some things will be the same but there are things that will be different.

Those of you who were able to attend the Friday afternoon sessions will have met Mrs. Binding and Mrs. Leggatt and your children will get to know the support staff quickly, when they first start. You will also be seeing Mrs. Binding and Mrs. Leggatt when they visit you for your home visit. Prior to the visit we will contact you to check that no one in your household has any symptoms of Covid 19 – a temperature, a new and continuous cough and/or a loss of/change to the sense of taste or smell and that no one in the household is self-isolating as part of the Track and Trace or due to returning from a country that has travel restrictions. We will also be reminding you that the meeting will ideally take place outside or if that is not possible the teachers will need to socially distance (at a distance of 2 metres) when inside.

Although things are getting back to normal, they will not quite be back to the way they were prior to lockdown, there are some changes in order that we can follow the Government guidelines to ensure the safety of the children and staff. The children will be with their whole class whilst continuing to follow positive hygiene routines and appropriate social distancing. Initially we will be operating two bubbles - a Year 1 and Year 2 bubble and a Reception bubble. We will have a staggered drop off and collection to reduce congestion and minimise adult contact. The timings will be:


Class	Drop off at school	Collection at the end of the school day
Year 2 (Badgers)	8.45am	2.50pm
Year 1 (Squirrels)	8.55am	3.00pm
Reception (Rabbits)	9.05am	2.40pm

When you bring/collect your child please line up by the cones at the allotted time and follow the one-way system around the playground and then out following the arrows on the ground. Due to the Covid – 19 restrictions, we are minimising the number of people entering the school building. Therefore, when your child first starts the Reception staff will be putting out some activities on the playground for you to do with your child to help settle them, if needed. When you and your child are ready to say goodbye to one another a member of the Reception staff will take your child in and show them where to put their things and what to do when they first enter the classroom. The staff have been busy in school getting the classrooms set up and below you will see pictures of Rabbit’s classroom. They have been set up following Government guidance.

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Social distancing

The scientific information published by the Department for Education (DfE) states, ‘We know that, unlike older children and adults, early years and primary age children cannot be expected to remain 2 metres apart from each other and staff.’ Although we are putting measures in place to socially distance pupils, we are realistic that this is virtually impossible with children of this age. They will be playing with others in their own bubble and the staff will be there to look after them. Our focus will therefore continue to be on hygiene – washing hands, sneezing into a tissue or the crook of our elbows, not touching our faces with our hands, limited sharing of resources and frequent cleaning of the spaces that the children and adults use in combination with limiting the contact with others through the bubbles.

The DfE have advised that schools should work through the hierarchy of measures set below when social distancing is not feasible.

<p>Avoiding contact with anyone with symptoms</p>	<p>We have a system in place where any pupils exhibiting Covid-19 symptoms will be taken to a separate room and their parents will be required to immediately come and collect them. A first aider will remain with them but will be required to wear, a mask, an apron and gloves.</p> <p>The child who is unwell will need to be taken to have a Covid 19 test by their parents, and their whole household will need to self-isolate until the result is received. All other members of staff and pupils within the unwell child’s ‘bubble’ will continue as normal (attending school and not isolating) until the test result is received. Where the child or staff member tests negative, they will return to school.</p> <p>Where the child or staff member tests positive, the school will contact the South East Health Protection Team who will carry out a risk assessment to decide what the next steps should be.</p>
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# Polesden Lacey Infant School




	Anyone, pupil or member of staff, who is in a household where someone displays symptoms of Covid – 19 must self-isolate for 14 days unless the person with symptoms returns a negative test for Covid-19. In this case the pupil or member of staff can return to school.
Frequent handwashing and good respiratory hygiene practices	We will continue to ensure that pupils wash their hands on arrival, before they eat their fruit snack (brought from home), before lunch, after going to the toilet and before going home.  The children will be reminded how to sneeze or cough into a tissue or their sleeve.  Please can you remind the children how to wash their hands correctly. Regular cleaning of settings	Daily cleaning continues to be in place, with an increase of cleaning frequently touched areas throughout the day.
Minimising contact and mixing	Staggered arrival times and playtimes/lunchtimes within the two bubbles means we can minimise the spread of germs.

It is still important to reduce contact between people as much as possible, and we can achieve that and reduce transmission risk by ensuring children, young people and staff where possible, only mix in a small, consistent group and that small group stays away from other people and groups. We have put detailed plans in place to ensure that this happens within school and ask that you support this by continuing to follow the Government guidelines on social distancing when the children are not in school. You must also follow the Track and Trace guidance announced by the Government on 27<sup>th</sup> May and the current Government rules on self-isolating for 14 days when returning from specified countries.

### Playtimes

To ensure all children have access to time outside, we are operating a staggered playtime system, which will allow all children within their bubble to play outside.

This will not look very different to normal playtime as Reception are operating as one bubble. We will however have specific equipment for Year 1 and 2 and different equipment for Reception as well as continued cleaning of the climbing equipment between bubbles.

As the weather will hopefully remain warm please can you remember to send your child in with their named sun hat and sun cream applied, as Staff members will be unable to apply sun cream in order to adhere to social distancing guidelines and our Sun Safety Policy. We may also have wet and chilly days so don't forget to check the forecast and send your child in with the appropriate named outdoor clothes!


### Resources

Please can children bring their own named plastic water bottle to and from home daily. Please fill with fresh water from home daily. We expect the Fruit Scheme, which provides a piece of fruit daily for every infant school pupil, to start on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> September.

### School Lunches

Our catering contractors will be providing hot school lunches from September and the children will be eating these in the hall with their class and bubble. The dining tables and chairs will be cleaned using antibacterial cleaning products between the Reception bubble and the Year 1 and Year 2 bubble.
