I saw a fabulous example of this during the week. Year 2 are learning about The Great Fire of London in History and in English they are writing poems about the fire. Mrs. Quinn and Mrs. West carefully planned the Forest School session to include the lighting of a fire (picture below). This gave the children the first hand experience of a fire, the sights, sounds and smells. They wrote some of their ideas down whilst they were sitting around the fire and then had these back in the classroom when they started to draft their poems. The children said that the experience in the woods, with the real fire, had really helped them understand what the fire was like.

Having seen some of their writing it is clear that they were inspired and they were able to use the experience to select words and phrases to use in their poems. I am looking forward to reading their poems when they are finished. Hopefully we can publish some on the website and in the Newsletter.

It is through this ideal that iDot hopes to help people, schools, groups, businesses and communities drive change and contribute to global efforts of restoring health to the planet. All entrants must do to enter is CLICK HERE to go to competition page, and post a transport-related iDot (carsharing to work, walking/cycling instead of driving, driving their EV if they have one, using public transport, etc), along with a photo of themselves doing their iDot, on the website before midnight on the 30th of November

Entrants must be 18+ to enter but as long as their parents opened the account in their name then your students could do their iDot(s) then ask their parents to post them.
