Q is for Quinoa

Quinoa is a healthy food that Andean farmers have shared with the world. While the appetite for quinoa has improved living standards for producers, to meet increased demand many quinoa farmers have expanded cultivation of the crop beyond their traditional high-elevation plots. This has implications for the long-term sustainability of quinoa farming which Fairtrade is working to address.

When you buy Fairtrade quinoa, you are helping to ensure that this food can continue to be enjoyed for many generations to come!

Ukraine

As a school we have families who have links both to Ukraine and to Russia. Please do be mindful of the conversations that you have with one another and with your children. One of our school values is 'respect' and another is to be 'caring', this would seem a perfect opportunity to show both values. If you have conversations with your children about the situation please do help them to understand that you cannot stereotype people or generalise. It is so important for us as a school that every child feels valued and welcome no matter what their ethnic origin or language they speak and that they feel confident in who they are and speak the language of the countries they have links to.

Professor Hill advises:

- **Give them the basics and don't avoid the conversation** Listen to their worries and provide honest answers to their questions about what is going on, don't overcomplicate your responses and try to give details at an age-appropriate level. Don't avoid answering their questions about the situation as this could promote more anxiety, but keep to basic facts.
- Ensure they feel supported and safe It's important to help children understand the level of threat to them and their friends and family. Explain this is happening in Ukraine, a different country and show this if necessary using a globe or map.
- Manage your own feelings Try to deal with your own feelings of stress and distress in a way that it is managed as your children will be sensitive to your reactions.
- Explain to your children that bad things can happen in the world but there is always some way we can help Plan together how you might deal with this situation through fundraising or other actions to support the Ukrainian community.
- Avoid exposure to a constant stream of news Be mindful of whether you have the radio or TV on all day, as children will be absorbing news without us realising it. Try to build in 'breaks' from the news, for example, if you are picking up your children from school, turn off the radio or make sure it isn't on a news station to provide a break from the constant exposure to worrying rolling news cycles.
- Watch where they are getting their news We know that fake news is an issue, particularly on social media sites so be mindful of what your children are absorbing and where they are getting it. Ensure they understand that not everything they see on social media sites is true, and they know what reliable sources of news they can access.

Seek advice and support if you are concerned about your child – School staff and educational psychologists can offer specific advice and support if you feel that your child is becoming overly anxious and distressed. Providing support and reassurance and diverting their thoughts through engagement in pleasurable activities can help.

The Great Easter Egg-stravaganza!

During the school morning, each class will hunt for eggs and find clues to form an Easter word. At the end the school day, every child will receive a chocolate egg to take home (as long as their parent / carer has given permission via our online form).



To continue to raise funds towards our outdoor classroom we will be asking for a donation of £4 for the egg hunt and £1 for mufti day. We are asking for online payments only please.

We appreciate that finances are very tight for a lot of families so please be assured that if you are unable to donate the £4 suggested as long as you complete the online permission form your child will still receive an egg. If you are unable to pay the full donation but are able to make a smaller contribution to help cover the costs that is also absolutely fine. Please feel free to have a confidential conversation with your class teacher or Ms Mole if this causes you any kind of difficulty.
