Welcome back to the second half of the Autumn term. I hope that you were all able to enjoy the break ; the children and staff have definitely returned refreshed.

This week you have had the opportunity to come into school and meet with the class teachers to discuss your child's progress and how you can support them. I hope that you found this both beneficial and enjoyable. We certainly loved having you back in the classrooms and we hope that you were pleased that you could see the place where your child does lots of their learning. Your support at home, with all aspects of learning, makes such as difference. Many of you will have seen, in recent letters from us, the statistics from a study carried out in America to see what difference reading to a child makes to their vocabulary. For those who haven't seen this yet, the findings, which are below, are eye opening! The study in America worked out how many words a child would have heard by the time they were 5 and the difference reading to them made.

Here's how many words kids would have heard by the time they were 5 years old:

Never read to, 4,662 words;

1-2 times per week, 63,570 words;

3-5 times per week, 169,520 words;

daily, 296,660 words;

and five books a day, 1,483,300 words.

Access to language opens up opportunities for our children, so please do keep reading great stories, poems, articles and books to your children.

Take care over the weekend, especially if you are watching any firework displays.

DIWALI


Diwali is the five-day Festival of Lights, celebrated by millions of Hindus, Sikhs and Jains across the world.
