Message from Mrs. Mole

One of the questions that I often get asked by prospective parents, is how can we help our child get ready for school. My answer always involves enjoy spending time with them and reading to them. Many of you will have already received the information below from me but not everyone has! Reading to your child and talking about books is so important and makes such a difference.

Researchers in the United States who had looked at the impact of parents reading with their children quoted the following figures about their findings:

Here's how many words kids would have heard by the time they were 5 years old:

Never read to, 4,662 words;

1–2 times per week, 63,570 words;

3-5 times per week, 169,520 words;

daily, 296,660 words;

and five books a day, 1,483,300 words

A report by the Department for Education in July 2023 states that, 'parents who engage their children in books prepare them to become committed and enthusiastic readers: they can transform their attitudes to reading. Their children learn to focus and share the enjoyment of the story; they learn how stories start and finish, and how a plot unravels and is resolved; they learn that books can transport them elsewhere.' and 'book-related talk introduces children to language that they might not hear in ordinary conversation, especially the vocabulary of the book itself. This primes them to understand what they read later, in their leisure reading and across the curriculum'.

I hope that you can all curl up on a chair and enjoy some time reading to your child this weekend.
