Christmas Performances

Following the wonderful show put on by Reception class this week we are really looking forward to welcoming you to our KS1 Christmas performances taking place next Tuesday and Thursday.

The show for KSI will be exactly the same on both dates but has been split to allow more room for parents at each show. We will not be issuing tickets this year but are restricting numbers to no more than 2 people per family, per year group.

If your child is in KS1 your 2 tickets can be used to attend one performance together or to have one person attend each of the 2 KS1 performances, if you cannot make the same date. We request that you do not bring siblings, unless they are one of your two tickets.

The Year 1 show (which includes the Year 2 children) will take place on Tuesday 17th December at 9.00am to 9.45am approximately.

The Year 2 show (which includes Year 1 children) will take place on Thursday 19th December starting at 9.00am to 9.45am approximately.

If Year 1 & 2 parents are not able to attend on the date allocated for your child's class performance there is capacity for you to attend on the alternative date. All we ask is that you let the school office know so that we can put out the correct number of chairs. (The show for both dates is exactly the same)

Christmas Lunch & Christmas Jumper day – 18th December

On the 18th December the school catering team will be serving up a delicious festive Christmas lunch.

We've also chosen this day as our annual Christmas Jumper day, where children are welcome to wear a Christmas jumper, full Christmas outfit, or their own weekend clothes. We are asking for a voluntary donation of £1 per child, which will be collected on the day and donated to "Billy's Battalion".



For those of you that aren't aware, this time last year Billy was in Reception Class when he was diagnosed with a DIPG brain tumour. Unfortunately the tumour was terminal and despite a valiant fight Billy very sadly passed away at Easter. In honour of Billy, who was the bravest little boy we knew, we will be donating any money collected to the charity that Billy's parents are setting up in his name "Billy's Battalion". This money will be used to support Abbie's Army who help to raise awareness and funds to support much needed research into this dreadful disease.
