## Message from Mrs. Mole

Yesterday afternoon, Rabbit children had a real treat when some parents, carers, grandparents and local residents came into school and read to them. The children thoroughly enjoyed themselves and delighted at the stories they listened to.



On one of my recent school tours one of the prospective parents asked what she should do to prepare her child to start school. I gave a few practical suggestions like helping the child to become independent in getting dressed and undressed, personal care and cutting up their food to get them ready for school lunches! Other than these ideas, my other words of wisdom were to read with their child and enjoy spending time doing things together. Researchers in the United States who had looked at the impact of parents reading with their children quoted the following figures about their findings: 'Here's how many words kids would have heard by the time they were 5 years old:

Never read to, 4,662 words

1–2 times per week, 63,570 words

3-5 times per week, 169,520 words

daily, 296,660 words

Five books a day, 1,483,300 words.

These figures never fail to astound me. Who would think that something so enjoyable, as reading to a young child on a regular basis, could make such an impact?


Nuts are healthy and good for you, they give you energy and fibre. It's really nice to give farmers who work really hard lots of money so buy fairtrade nuts!

### **Attendance**

At Polesden Lacey Infant School, it is our aim that all of our pupils achieve their full potential throughout their time at our school. We believe that pupils need to attend school every day to give each of them the chance to take advantage of the educational opportunities we offer. Ultimately, missing lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind; research demonstrates that children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary school. It is our expectation at Polesden Lacey Infant School that pupils will achieve an attendance of at least 96% each year.

Most of the children at Polesden Lacey Infant School do have excellent attendance but we know that, at this time of year, with lots of bugs going around there maybe days when your child is too unwell to be in school.
