Anti-bullying

Polesden Lacey Infant School is committed to working with staff, pupils and parents and carers to create and maintain a happy and thriving school community where bullying is not tolerated. The school Anti-Bullying Policy has been developed with due regard for our duties and obligations under existing legislation and public sector duties for the safeguarding and wellbeing of all our pupils and we will take all steps to ensure their safety.

Although there is no legal definition of bullying, we recognise that it is repetitive, intentional and hurtful. The hurt can be physical, verbal or psychological.

At Polesden Lacey Infant School we promote the positive behaviour of pupils through our Behaviour Policy and our Friendship Code: A good friend is someone who... Listens to you; Makes up if you fall out; Does not get you into trouble; Looks out for you when you are sad; Says and does things that make you feel good; Cooperates with you; Takes it in turn to choose the game; Doesn't mind if you sometimes play with other people; Is polite to you.

At the young age of our children, bullying is rare but we know that it can happen. We tell the children that if they have any concerns that someone is being treated unkindly or being bullied or that they are being treated unkindly or being bullied they must tell an adult. This could be a member of staff or an adult at home and they will help to stop the unkind behaviour or bullying.

We hope that this is not something that your child experiences and we work to stop any unkind behaviour before it becomes bullying.
