On 15 January, the River Thames Scheme (RTS) launches a communications campaign called Your View Matters to support the launch of its Statutory Consultation.

Statutory Consultation is a six-week period where in-person and virtual events take place from 00:00 on Monday 22 January 2024 to 23:59 on Monday 4 March. The scheme uses this period, to formally consult with local communities and key stakeholders, to ensure the final project design is informed and influenced by those who live, work, and use the area. We are keen to ensure all those who have an interest in sharing their views on the final design for the RTS, know where, when and how to take part.

The RTS is an integrated scheme, working in partnership between Surrey County Council and the Environment Agency. It aims at reducing the risk of flooding to homes, businesses and infrastructure, in addition to improving access to quality green and open space, creating a more sustainable travel network and increasing biodiversity.
