We are excited to update you on our partnership with The LEO Trust. Every application, by a school, to join an academy trust is reviewed by the regional director for the area where the school is located. At this stage they consider if due diligence was followed and if the partnership is appropriate and positive. If they consider this to be the case an academy order will be issued. We are delighted to tell you that the Academy Order has been issued and we are moving to the next phase of joining the family of schools that makes up The LEO Trust. We continue to be impressed with how LEO operate, the support already being given and their desire to learn from us. Every time I have a meeting with representatives from LEO, they always seem to coincide with a Forest School session and those visiting are bowled over with what they see. (I'm not sure if they book the time on purpose or it is purely coincidental but the wonder on their faces when they see the children enjoying Forest School fills my bucket every time!) You will also notice that we are using LEO mini-buses to take the children to trips that are coming up like Badger trip to a mosque, Squirrel trip to a synagogue and Rabbit trip to Pizza Express. This opens up wonderful opportunities to enhance the children's learning without the financial implications that using a commercial coach company bring.
