As you may remember I was taking part in a Chocolate truffle making session last Friday and the photograph on the right is what I made. The session was really interesting, not only did I learn how to make the truffles but also about some of the farmers who grow the cocoa.

In case you want to try it the recipe was:

Ingredients

90g Fairtrade dark chocolate (70%)

90g Divine toffee and Sea Salt milk chocolate

227g Clotted Cream

Fairtrade Cocoa Powder

Method

Start to melt the 2 chocolates in a bowl over a pan of hot water.



Once they are about 50% melted add in the clotted cream and continue to melt until everything is combined.

Leave to cool and become a solid and then shape into small balls.

Coat in the cocoa powder (I also coated some in chopped pistachio nuts)
