Can we please remind you that the children should not be bring in items from home unless the teacher has specifically requested or given permission for them to do so. This includes all toys, including soft toys, cars, purses, beads, trinkets etc. Children get very upset when they get lost or damaged which can happen very easily.

Unless there is a specific medical reason that the staff are aware of and have authorized, sweets should definitely not be in your child's bag, this includes throat sweets, mints etc. We have had cases of children swapping sweets in the cloakroom. This has the potential to be extremely dangerous should children with allergies become exposed.
