Message from Ms. Mole

One of the unique things, that we do at Polesden Lacey Infant School, is our 'Circle Time'. It is not something that I can take credit for. It was my predecessor, Mrs. Keedy, who started it but it was one of the things, that the children who were involved in interviewing me for the role of Headteacher, asked if I would keep, if I became the head. They said that they loved being able to discuss different topics and help to make decisions and so I quickly agreed that we would keep 'Circle Time'. All the children in the school are involved, working in small groups of children, from all the classes, with an adult, they discuss topical matters from school to local issues to world problems. A couple of weeks ago they reviewed playtimes. Did they like the changes that had been made? Was there anything else that they would like to see? Mrs. Mullins reviewed all of the feedback and she was pleased to see that the majority of the children were positive about the changes and she also took some of the suggestions

that the children made. One of the ideas put forward was to have 'Playtime Stars'. We have now introduced this to the children and the staff are busy picking the Playtime Star everyday. If they are chosen (for doing things like playing well, improving a skill, being resilient or being helpful and caring) they are awarded a little certificate and can choose

a badge, which they can keep. Some of your children will already have received a certificate and badge and so know what they look like. For others, here are some pictures of what to look out for.

Squirrels: Dashel for being really helpful caring for our nature areas.


Badgers: Henry for being enthusiastic and hardworking and curious and caring for nature.
