Our Oceans Our Future

Throughout this year Badger class have been taking part in a project about 'Our Oceans, Our Future' along with some of the other schools in the local area. In the autumn term they visited The Natural History Museum, where they learnt about some of the



creatures that inhabit our oceans and also some of the problems that rubbish and particularly plastic is having of the wildlife. Miss. Joslin revisited the issues of plastic and other waste on beaches in her Geography topic in the spring term and our arts week this week has focused in all three classes on the oceans and the difficulties and solutions to those difficulties.

On Tuesday 4th June, some of the Year 2 children will be joining children from St. Lawrance, Eastwick and Great Bookham School to exhibit some of their art work, a poem that they wrote together and to play a game that will help others understand how we can reduce, recycle and reuse plastic to slow down the amount that currently ends up in our waterways. Miss. Joslin will be taking the class to see the exhibition during the school day. There is an opportunity for all childrne and families to go along and see what we have been doing and what the other schools have done as well. From 4pm tp 5.50pm the exhibition is open to all children, parents and carers. It would be great to see many of you there.
