Important—Sun Hats & Sunscreen

Even though it isn't always particularly sunny at the moment the UV levels are high and can cause skin damage through the clouds. To help protect your children please remember to send them to school with sun hats, apply sun cream before you come to school and bring a rain coat. The weather has been unpredictable so far this year so we need you to plan for all eventualities! Whether it is sunny or wet we love to be outside in it!

It is your responsibility to make sure that sunscreen has been applied to your child before they come to school. Unless there is a very good reason, ie history of skin cancer or the like, staff do not have the time to be reminding and reapplying sunscreen at lunchtime. Most good sunscreen will last for the duration of the school day so for the majority of children we would not expect them to have sun screen at school. If sunscreen is required you must complete a medical form and hand the form and sunscreen In to the school office. It must not be left in your child's school bag.

We strongly recommend the legionnaire style sun hat as this helps to protect the children's necks and ears as well as keeping the sun off their heads and faces. If you do not have a sun hat at home we do have them for sale in the school office at a cost of £4.00. Payment can be made by cash or bank transfer, Mrs Cummings can give you the school bank details.

If your child does not have a sun hat with them ,they will be allowed out to play, but will only be allowed in the shady areas. This may restrict the games that they want to play with their friends.

Please note that year 1 and 2 are only really outside for 15 minutes at break time and 45 minutes at the absolute most at lunchtime and this is in 2 separate stints as they go out for a bit, then come in for lunch and then go out again afterwards. Reception children will be in the sun more than that as they also play outside throughout the school day. If the weather is particularly hot and sunny we open up the woodlands at break and lunchtimes for all children to play in as it is shaded by the trees and

therefore reduces the amount of sun exposure.
