### Message From Ms. Mole.

I can't resist having the new Polesden Lacey Bears in my message to you—they are adorable. The children are currently bombarding me with potential names and saying how excited they are to be collecting their bears, if they are lucky enough to have been bought one. Thank you to The Friends for the inspired idea and sourcing such beautifully made bears.



As you know we are hoping to have our Sports day next week, on Wednesday. I have my fingers crossed for beautiful weather and no rain. We are hoping for it to be a fun and bringing together event for the children and parents. Up to two parents can attend. You may be aware that the numbers of COVID cases in the Mole Valley area are on the rise and so I wanted to take this opportunity to remind you of the social distancing guidelines and what is considered 'Close Contact'. Close contact is defined as:

- face-to-face contact under 1 metre for any length of time including talking to them or being coughed on
- being within 1 metre of each other for 1 minute or longer
- being within 2 metres of each other for more than 15 minutes in total in 1 day

If any of the above applied to any of us, in regard to being near to someone who then goes on to test positive for COVID – 19, there is a requirement to self-isolate for that person. Unfortunately, although you are less likely to develop COVID after contact outside there is still a requirement to self-isolate!

As an additional precaution to social distancing and mask wearing, I would ask that the adult /adults who are coming to sports day to cheer on their child or children, also do a Lateral Flow Test prior to coming into school. Although they are not infallible they are picking up some asymptomatic cases. We are so close to the end of term and I would hate for any family to have to go into self-isolation.

On a more positive note we are including the links to the parent survey at the end of this newsletter. There is a bottle of Prosecco up for grabs! All named surveys completed by Thursday 8th July will be entered into a draw and the name picked out will win a bottle of Prosecco.

I hope that you all have a great weekend, that Badger Bubble enjoy the end of their self-isolation and Miss. Williams can see the end of her self-isolation in sight.

Please remember that all adults and children over the age of 11 are encouraged to complete twice weekly Lateral Flow Test. Although this test is not 100% reliable in detecting positive cases of COVID— 19 it does pick up some cases. There has been a dramatic increase in the number of cases across the country and in Surrey over the past few weeks and as a school we can see the impact of this increase.
