
Message from the Friends

Library Summer Reading Challenge

As we approach the summer holidays, Leatherhead and Bookham Libraries would like to share information about this year's Summer Reading Challenge. The Summer Reading Challenge is the UK's biggest reading for pleasure programme for children aged 4 to 11, delivered via public libraries. Children can sign up for free at their local library or online. Last year, over 10,300 children joined the Challenge with Surrey Libraries.

How it works:

- Children can sign up at their local library, where they will receive a special sticker booklet.
- They set a summer reading goal and choose books, eBooks, or audiobooks of their choice logging their reading will earn rewards such as stickers, a bookmark, and seed packet.
- The Libraries will also be running a programme of free themed events and activities!
- Children who complete the Challenge are presented with a certificate and a special wristband.
