**Charlie W** was caring and helped the adults sort out the water bottles.


**William P** showed that he cared for the classroom environment by taking the bin round to collect paper.








# Eco - Tip

Fairtrade encourages farmers and producers to use efficient methods of production and xeriscaping reduces the need for extra water from irrigation. Plants are selected because they need little or no water beyond what the natural climate provides. The soil is also improved and maintained which is extremely helpful to growers in dry regions. This results in a better deal and greater sustainability for Fairtrade farmers.
