The behaviour in school is generally excellent and the behaviour policy is there to promote positive attitudes to learning and interacting with each other. This policy outlines the consistent approach to positive behaviour management that we adopt to equip the children with a lifelong set of behaviour skills and values. It defines acceptable and unacceptable standards of behaviour

and the rewards and sanctions that occur in response to the behaviours exhibited by the children.
