

Love in a Box

You will have received an email and a leaflet in the children's bags about 'Love in a Box'. This is an initiative that we have supported in the past but due to COVID was not running for the last few years. The Mustard Seed charity collects boxes of gifts that are taken to Eastern Europe and given out to children who would really benefit from receiving a box of gifts. On average they send our 30.000 boxes a year and each one is individually received by a child.



All the information that you need regarding how to donate is contained in the leaflet which is in your child's school bag. We realise that there could be an significant expense to putting together the box and adding the donation towards the cost delivering the gifts. Some of you may wish to join with another family to send one box between you. I am sure that they children would gain a lot thinking of others and what another child would like to find in a Christmas box.
