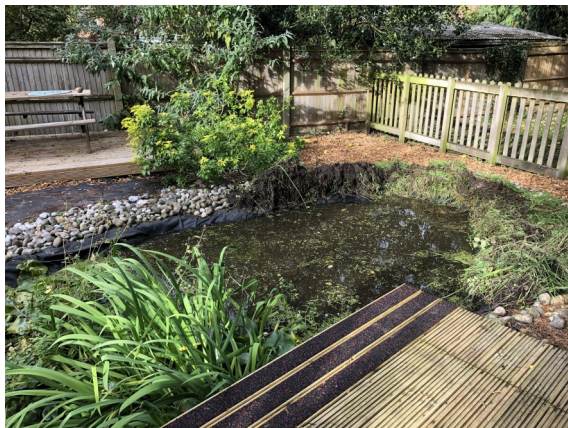
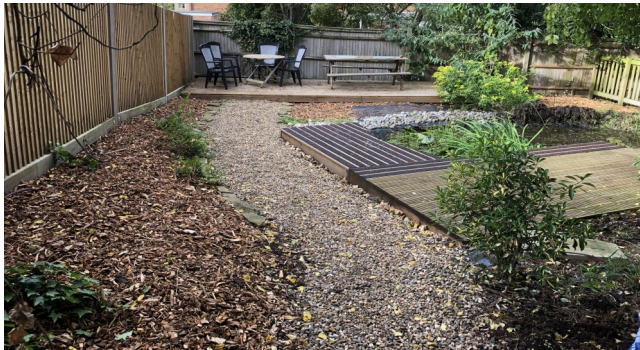

Surrey Educational psychologist service offer the school a wide range of resources, training and assessment.

They are also offering free training for parents on 'Emotion Coaching'. 'Emotion Coaching' is an approach that the school follows and have had recent training on. 'Emotion coaching' is an approach which helps children and young people to understand the different emotions they experience, why they occur and how to handle them. This helps children and young people to learn how to regulate their emotions and behavior.

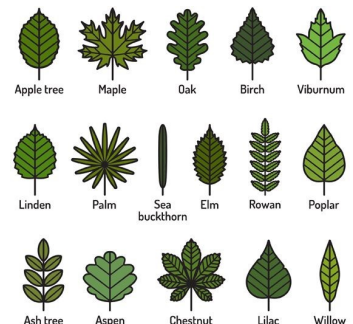
Oliver: was courageous when he was worried about the nasal flu vaccine

Science & Technology Week 19th—23rd October

As part of our special Investigate and Create week, The Junior Stem Company is coming into our school on **Thursday 22nd October** to run a Lego Robotics workshop for the children. During the day Year 1 and 2 will be designing a Lego creation and then programming the laptops to make their creations move.

Junior Stem are offering the children in Squirrel and Badger classes the chance to participate in an additional Lego robotics workshop which will give them the opportunity to develop their knowledge further. This will run after school from 3-4pm and will cost £5. If the session is over subscribed we will select the children able to take part by 'taking names out of a hat'. If your child is allocated a space in the Lego Robotics Workshop we will email you during the afternoon of Monday 19th October so payment can then be made.

Please note that in conjunction with The Junior Stem company we have carried out a Covid—19 risk assessment to ensure that this fabulous activity can go ahead safely. The person delivering the sessions in class and after school will be wearing a mask whilst working with the children.

Open Day - New Parents

Due to public demand we have now added an additional date — Thursday 29th October

Subject to any further restrictions imposed by the Government we are planning to hold this year's Open Day on Wednesday 28th October which falls within the school's Half Term Holiday.

To enable us to comply with current Government guidelines each tour will consist of no more than 5 adults plus the Headteacher, making a total of 6 persons present at any one time. This year we are asking that children do not attend the tour and if at all possible that attendance is limited to one adult per household. This will hopefully enable us to give as many families as possible the opportunity to visit our school. All adults will be required to wear a mask whilst in the school hall and during the tour inside the building.

The session will consist of a presentation in the school hall by the Headteacher, followed by a tour around the inside of the school and then finishing with a tour of our lovely grounds. Each tour will last approximately 1 hour and cleaning will take place inside the hall prior to each session.
