Squirrels: Kenny for being a caring friend and encouraging others to learn.


Badgers: Thomas for being a caring and helpful member of Badger Class!

You will have received an email and a leaflet in the children's bags about 'Love in a Box'. This is an initiative that we have supported in the past but due to COVID was not running for the last few years. The Mustard Seed charity collects boxes of gifts that are taken to Eastern Europe and given out to children who would really benefit from receiving a box of gifts. On average they send our 30.000 boxes a year and each one is individually received by a child.
