Appointments take place in your child's classroom. Please enter via the school playground and wait in the outside classroom until the teacher calls you in. Please note the playground has limited lighting so you might like to bring a torch with you if your appointment is after dark.

In fairness to other parents each appointment will start and finish promptly. If you need further time to discuss any concerns after your 10 minutes are up please make another appointment to see the teacher separately at a later date.

Any accompanying school age children will be asked to sit quietly in the class book corner, where books will be provided for them to look at. Please keep toddlers with you during the meeting.

Many of you will have had the opportunity to look at your child's books on Open Afternoon this week (Wednesday 5th November) if you were unable to do so and would like to look at the books on parents evening please let the teacher know in advance so she can have them ready.

Parent/Carer Safeguarding Briefing Session—Reminder

On Monday 11th November from 2.30pm to 3pm, we will be running a Parent/Carer Volunteer Safeguarding Briefing session.
